



## ASSEMBLING YOUR DREAM TEAM

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*With so many details to cover for your wedding, you'll need a dream team to help pull it all off. Here's a list of all the various vendors you may need to help bring your dream wedding to life.*

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### **WEDDING PLANNER**

You may be asking yourself, do I need a wedding planner? If you're a DIY kind of bride, with a lot of know-how, probably not. If you're planning a logistically complicated event--you probably should. Are you happy to speak directly with each vendor--you probably don't. If you're too busy to think of centerpieces and answer all the questions each vendor may have, you probably should. It's tough to say whether you should or shouldn't, but there's no doubt that a wedding planner will make your life a whole lot easier in the planning process. And also remember that many of them offer a la carte services like design and coordination in case you don't want to work with them in a comprehensive way.

### **DAY-OF COORDINATOR**

If you're not hiring a planner, you may be thinking about hiring a day-of coordinator. This individual will be responsible for making sure your day-of timeline flows smoothly, the processional is cued accurately, and is there in case Uncle George has a little too much to drink and needs a cab called early. Simply put, like a planner they're there on the day-of to make sure you don't have to think of anything else other than getting married and celebrating. The biggest difference here is that you will be on your own for planning, and they will pick up where you leave off, and make sure it goes off without a hitch.

### **CATERER**

We may be a bit partial, but we think that food is truly at the heart of every celebration. It's important to make sure that your menu represents you as a couple, and is willing to go that extra mile to make that happen. Schedule a meeting to discuss your vision, and try to make it to a tasting if you can, and don't forget to ask for testimonials and references from past events. Catering is one of the biggest investments in your wedding budget, and you want to make sure you have a team that respects that decision-making process. Also remember that your caterers will be your front-line during your reception, so pay attention to how they treat you from the very beginning, as it's a good indicator of how they'll treat you and your guests on the day-of.



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**PRO TIP:** *Don't be afraid to ask for recommendations. Good vendors are a little picky about who they work with, because they know a great team makes everyone shine brighter.*

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## **OFFICIANT**

More and more often we see family and friends becoming ordained to officiate at weddings, but if not, know that there are a lot of professional officiants who can serve as a great resource for everything from processions to seating.

## **FLORIST**

Are organic flowers important to you, do you want something avant garde, or are you looking to bulk purchase flowers and have your mother do the centerpieces? All these will help guide you to the right florist, and make sure that they aesthetically line up with what you're interested in doing. Don't be shy about asking to see a portfolio of their work, or photos from past events, they're artists at heart and love to share their work!

## **PHOTOGRAPHER**

This is all about aesthetics and your decision should heavily lean on the photographers past work. These images will last your entire lifetime, and you want to make sure that whoever you pick will capture those memories in such a way that will bring them to life for years to come. Not only will your pictures last, but this is the vendor you will be interacting with the most on the day-of the wedding itself. Make sure you feel comfortable and at ease around them--meeting with your photographer before booking is a great way to do this, or even try them on during an engagement photo session before committing to the full wedding portfolio.

## **TRANSPORTATION**

If you're planning on serving alcohol, we **STRONGLY** recommend hiring a transportation or bus service. Not only does it cover everyone for liability reasons, but it's a courteous and appreciated way to encourage your guests to relax and enjoy themselves while staying safe. When looking at companies to hire, reputation and reliability are your two primary qualifiers.. Make sure you are working with a company familiar with the area you're getting married at, (so they don't get lost), make sure that they are know your schedule and are punctual (so they're not late), make sure that you know their fee structure (to avoid hidden or overage fees), and that they are well established and licensed (so you



know they're for real). If you have a planner or day-of coordinator, they will be able to handle the direct day-of timekeeping, and don't hesitate to ask for recommendations.

## **SALON SERVICES**

Do you want a full on spa experience leading up to your event, or do you want someone to come to your home or venue to pamper you and your bridesmaids just beforehand. Either way, it's important to make sure that you're on the same page with what you want. Get a makeup and hair test done with them early on, and take pictures that you can bring with you next time as a reminder.

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**PRO TIP:** *One thing to remember above all else when picking each vendor, is to make sure you feel comfortable communicating with them. It is their responsibility to help bring your vision to life, and if they don't listen, it's probably not a good match.*

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## **MUSIC**

Maybe you want to march to a cello playing Pachabel Canon, but you want to fist pump into the wee hours of the morning to EDM, no matter what you're looking for, book your musicians well in advance and have a firm plan in mind. No matter if you're looking for a band or a DJ, they will help guide the timeline and flow to your event, so make sure you communicate your vision and timeline with them. They can help make recommendations for breaks for first dances, toasts and cake cuttings too, which you can then share with your other vendors as well.

## **LOCAL SERVICES & RESOURCES**

Make sure you investigate the various procedures for marriage licensing in the town that you're getting married in. Or if you're planning on having your ceremony somewhere like Acadia National Park, make sure you have the correct permit required for this through their administrative offices.
